- England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales are the United Kingdom's countries.
- London is the capital city of England and the River Thames runs through the middle.
- The closer to the equator a continent is the hotter it is, the further away it gets the colder it is. Africa is the hottest continent because the equator runs through it.

**KEY VOCABULARY**

- Continent— a very large area of land that includes all the islands with it
- Ocean—a large area of sea
- Population - the number of people that live in a particular place
- Landmark—a well known building or place
- Desert—a large area of land that has very little rainfall and where not much grows
- Oceans—a large area of water
- Rainforest - a large area of land with lots of tall trees and plenty of rainfall
- Climate—the usual weather conditions of an area
- Temperature—mild weather, neither hot nor cold
- Tropical—hot and humid
- Aerial- seen from above
- Seas—bodies of water
- Equator—an imaginary line drawn around the middle of Earth dividing the northern and southern hemispheres.
